**H.E. IMAM EDY MULYONO, NON-RESIDENT AMBASSADOR OF THE REPUBLIC OF  
INDONESIA TO SAINT VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES PRESENTS LETTERS OF  
CREDENCE TO THE GOVERNOR GENERAL OF SAINT VINCENT AND THE  
GRENADINES**

**SAINT VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES, July 20, 2022** – H.E., Imam Edy Mulyono, Non-Resident Ambassador of the Republic of Indonesia to Saint Vincent and the Grenadines presented Letters of Credence to H.E. Dame Susan Dougan, GCMG, OBE, Governor General of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines at Government House on Wednesday July 20, 2022.

During the presentation to Her Excellency, the Governor General, Ambassador Mulyono expressed that his Government is pleased to note that trade between Indonesia and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines has increased over the past years and anticipates greater collaboration and cooperation between public and private sector officials to identify the needs and trade potentials on a range of important issues between both countries.

Ambassador Mulyono also met with Senator The Hon. Keisal M. Peters, Minister of State for Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade and other senior government officials. During the bilateral discussion, Minister Peters highlighted various avenues for strengthening the bilateral cooperation between the Republic of Indonesia and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines such as access for training opportunities for Vincentians in textile, culture exchanges, and enhanced cooperation in areas of mutual interest at the regional and international levels. Minister Peters also expressed thanks on behalf of the Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines to the Republic of Indonesia for their assistance in procurement of a school bus which will be officially handed over on Friday July 22, 2022. As a means of developing strong bilateral cooperation with this country, Ambassador Mulyono expressed opportunity for capacity building programs and exchange of experiences in agriculture, tourism and disaster risk management.

The Republic of Indonesia and this country established diplomatic relations on November 30, 1993. Since then, both countries have engaged in friendly exchanges with shared views as part of the Non-Aligned Movement and G-77.

Ambassador Mulyono has residency in Caracas, Republic of Venezuela. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade welcomes the newly accredited Ambassador wishes him tremendous success throughout his tenure, and looks forward to the future cooperation between both countries.
